Under the Influence: The Spirit of Fear Pastor Shane Warren

- **2 Timothy 1:6-7** Therefore I remind you to stir up the gift of God which is in you through the laying on of my hands. ⁷ For **God has not given us a spirit of fear**, but of power and of love and of a sound mind.
 - Paul encourages Timothy to stir up the gift it had gone dormant
 - 1 Timothy 4:14 Timothy neglected the gift
 - The spirit of fear will stifle your gift

Luke 21:25-28 - "And there will be signs in the sun, in the moon, and in the stars; and on the earth distress of nations, with perplexity, the sea and the waves roaring; ²⁶ men's hearts failing them from fear and the expectation of those things which are coming on the earth, for the powers of the heavens will be shaken. ²⁷ Then they will see the Son of Man coming in a cloud with power and great glory. ²⁸ Now when these things begin to happen, look up and lift up your heads, because your redemption draws near."

Romans 8:15 - "For you did not receive the spirit of bondage again to fear, but you received the Spirit of adoption by whom we cry out, "Abba, Father."

2 Samuel 23:20-21 - Benaiah was the son of Jehoiada, the son of a valiant man from Kabzeel, who had done many deeds. He had killed two lion-like heroes of Moab. He also had gone down and killed a lion in the midst of a pit on a snowy day. ²¹ And he killed an Egyptian, a spectacular man. The Egyptian had a spear in his hand; so he went down to him with a staff, wrested the spear out of the Egyptian's hand, and killed him with his own spear.

An example of fearlessness: Benaiah

- God has called us to be radical Christians being radical is synonymous with fearless
- If this is the case Benaiah was definitely fearless! This man chased a lion into a pit on a snowy day.
- Usually, when the image of the King of the jungle wanders into the optical nerve and registers on the cerebral cortex it inspires one primary reaction: RUN!!!
- NORMAL PEOPLE DON'T CHASE LIONS

LION CHASERS REALIZE:

1. Lion chasers realize the greatest OPPORTUNITIES are usually the SCARIEST lions!

- Taking no risk is the GREATEST risk
- David Whyte said, "The price of our vitality is the sum of our fears..."
 - i. Life is not valued by the amount of your <u>POSSESSIONS</u>, but the amount of your <u>EXPERIENCES!</u>
- Irrational fears and misconceptions keep us from abundant living
- Faith is the process of unlearning your irrational fears!

2. Lion chasers realize the spiritually mature SEEK and SEIZE God-ordained opportunities!

- What sets lion chasers apart isn't the outcome, but the courage to chase God-sized dreams despite the difficulties
- Courage is:
 - i. Doing what is right regardless of the **CIRCUMSTANCES**
 - ii. Doing what is right regardless of the **CONSEQUENCES**
- G.K. Chesterton said, "How much happier you would be, how much more of you there would be, if the hammer of a higher God could smash your small cosmos..."
- At some point in your life you have to make a choice between fear and boredom

3. Lion chasers realize the courageous **DEFY** the **ODDS!**

- He was a 2 to 1 underdog when fighting the Moabites
- The odds were against him with the 7 ½ ft. tall Egyptian He had a club compared to the spear
- The odds were against him with the Lion, the snow, in a pit, etc...
 - i. A lion runs 35 miles per hour
 - ii. An average lion weighs 350-450 lbs
 - iii. Has a bite force of 950 lbs per sq. inch
 - iv. Lions teeth are perfectly placed as to fit between the cervical vertebrae of its prey to snap its neck
- He didn't focus on his disadvantages, he didn't make excuses.
- There is a pattern in the scripture: **sometimes God won't intervene until something** has become humanly impossible.
 - i. In Judges 6 Gideon's army of 32k is vastly outnumbered by the Midianites, but God said, "your army is too big..."

4. Lion chasers realize that you don't let what's <u>WRONG</u> with you keep you from worshipping what's <u>RIGHT</u> with God.

When I hit an emotional, spiritual slump it is usually because I'm more focused on the snow, the pit and the lion than I am on the opportunity to see God do the miraculous.

- Worship keeps us focused on the big picture!
- The most important choice you make every day is your attitude.
- JOY is mind over matter!
- Worship:
 - i. Changes the atmosphere
 - ii. Charges the atmosphere
- The <u>OUTCOME</u> of life is always determined by the <u>OUTLOOK</u> of life!

Conclusion: Its time to turn you faith on in adversity!

The *adversity effect:* For most of us, landing in a pit with a lion on a snowy day would be bad luck. But, it is adversity that gave Benaiah an opportunity to distinguish himself as a warrior. Without this adversity he would have faded into the script of scripture. Now everyone is telling the story of his courageous adventure.

When you die is there going to be a story told about your adventurous life, or will you gently slide off into the sunset without leaving anything memorable for others to recount?
